## PRESIDENTIAL DISASTER DECLARATION INFORMATION

State wide damage from any incident	\$ 1,000,000.00
County required damage ( \$ 3.27 per capita x 44,828 )	\$ 146,587.56
Private non profit, rural water, rural electric city, township, road district, etc.	\$ 1,000.00

## PRELIMINARY DAMAGE ASSESSMENT ( PDA )

All damage reports need to be delivered to the County Office of Emergency Management, to be totaled and reported to the County Commission. If there is sufficient damage to be a part of a Presidential Disaster Declaration, the commission signs a county declaration, which is sent to The State Office of Emergency Management. If the damages meet or exceed the one million dollar threshold from all involved counties, the governor signs a state declaration, and it is sent to President of The United States.

## DUNS NUMBER

Any applicant that may receive federal funds as a result of future disasters will need to apply for a DUNS number before FEMA will deem their entity an eligible applicant as a result of a Presidential Disaster Declaration. This is done with a phone call to Dunn and Bradstreet to register their entity and obtain a number. The phone number to Dunn and Bradstreet is 1-866-705-5711 and press 6 or applicants may apply via the internet at the following website: <http://fedgov.dnb.com/webform> and then click on Begin DUNS search request process. You will be asked to provide an SIC code. That number is 9511.

If your entity does not have a DUNS number, it would be wise to obtain one soon to avert a "stall" in the declaration process in the future.
